

1. Sustainable IT

IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF IT TOOLS

- I set the screen saver of my computer after 10 minutes of non-use.
- I adapt the brightness of the screen according to my current needs and natural light
- I limit the number of open applications and the number of tabs on the Internet
- I adapt in time and number the active Virtual Machines to a minimum use
- I systematically turn off and unplug my computer when I leave my workstation or when I'm not using it.
- I use the darkmode when available
- I take care of my computer equipment and make it last.

KEEP CONTROL OF EMAILS

- I use share links to transfer internal files instead of using attachments
- I create lightweight and well-designed attachments (image compression, pdf)
- I do not use my professional email signature for internal exchanges
- I sort, organize and clean my mailbox regularly. I physically move and talk to my colleague rather than send an information email to my collaborator if he is available
- I limit the use of instant messaging
- I avoid inserting images and GIFs in my emails and instant messages.

SUPPORT THE 0 PAPER OBJECTIVE

- I only print when necessary and the use of my print is sustainable. Sometimes, adapting the brightness of the screen makes it easier to read and avoids printing
- If printing is essential, I print on both sides to divide the number of sheets printed
- I take care not to print unnecessary mentions of an email or a web page
- I reuse any one-side printed sheets as draft sheets.

2. Mobility

- I have the possibility of homeworking in order to reduce consumption linked to commuting.
- I prefer public transport or even better I use bicycle and/or I walk.
- I propose carpooling to my colleagues when possible.
- I limit business travel by offering telephone meetings or video conferences.
- I prefer travelling by train rather than plane.



3. Use of the Premises

ADAPTING TO THE TEMPERATURE

- I do not modify the temperature of the workspaces without checking the ambient temperature and the general feeling of my colleagues
- A thermostat/thermometer is at my disposal in each workspace to know the real temperature so that I can adapt to it
- When I'm cold, I wear warm clothing to improve my comfort before increasing the temperature of the workspaces
- The heating and air conditioning is adapted according to the hours of presence in the premises.

SAVE ELECTRICITY - IT IS LIMITED

- LED bulbs are installed throughout the company to limit electricity consumption
- Even with presence detectors, I only turn on the lights if necessary and make sure to turn them off as soon as they are no longer needed.
- If my workstation is not bright enough, I can easily move around the premises to feel better
- I always turn off the light when leaving a room.

BE ATTENTIVE TO WATER CONSUMPTION

- I prefer the dishwasher which consumes less water than washing by hand. I choose the eco cycle and wait for the dishwasher to be full before starting a wash
- I don't let the tap run unnecessarily
- I inform the Office Manager as soon as I detect a leak.

4. Waste

SORT ALL WASTE

- I use the provided bins to recycle (or not) according to their categories (Paper, Plastic, Glass, Aluminum, Coffee Capsule, Organic).
- I systematically put used batteries in the recycling bin.

BAN DISPOSABLES

- I adapt my paper towel consumption to my real need and not to my comfort
- The company provides washable mugs and cutlery, no disposable are available
- As an employee, I have my own flask and drink water at the fountains
- When I buy my meal outside, I take a reusable bag.
